Cross-Border trail from Ettelbruck (LU) to La Roche-en-Ardenne (BE) → 158 km in total

Divided in two trails:

- 1. Lee Trail 52 km (Ettelbruck Kautenbach)
- 2. Eislek Trail 106 km (Kautenbach La Roche-en-Ardenne)
- → Divided into 8 daily stages (LT:3 / ET:5)
- → Integration of accommodation possibilities (Hotels & Campings)
- → Easy access to free public transport

→ "Lee" is the luxembourgish word for the typical mountain ridges that can be found in the Éislek Region

__A bit of history

- → The region is set in the East of Luxembourg near the German border
- → For 200 years, people have come to hike and admire the extraordinary sand stone rockformations that were created 200 million years ago
- → The Regional Tourist Office of the Mullerthal Region was created in 2007:
 - Development of the Mullerthal Region as a region of tourist attraction
 - Promote the Geopark & support the efforts to obtain the UNESCO Global Geopark label

Concept of the "Mullerthal Trail"

- → Some 20 years ago, hiking paths of the region did no longer correspond to the demands of the modern hiker
- → With the European programme called LEADER (support of rural areas)
- → New hiking concept for a long-distance regional hike
- → Mullerthal Trail, 112 km, set up in 3 Routes of 36 km, 38 km & 38 km
- → All the local hiking paths were transformed into circular & hiker-friendly tracks






"Mullerthal Trail" Route 1


On **112 km**, the Mullerthal Trail leads through the varied landscapes of the Mullerthal Region - Luxembourg's Little Switzerland

→ Route 1: 36 km change of landscapes typical for the region



_"Mullerthal Trail" Route 2

→ Route 2: 38 km leads through the heart of Luxembourg's Little Switzerland and brings you to spectacular rock formations



_"Mullerthal Trail" Route 3

→ Route 3: 38 km is characterized not only by the rocks but by enchanting stream valleys and romantic castles.



- → Since 2014, the Mullerthal Trail has been a Leading Quality Trail - Best of Europe (LQT)
- → LQT's are among the best hiking routes in Europe, certified according to high standards set by the European Ramblers Association
- → Some characteristics of Leading Quality Trails:
- Natural paths, impressive landscapes, picturesque towns, cultural sights, distinct signposting, luggage transport along the trail, accommodations, continuous accessibilty to the trail, etc.








__Natur- & Geopark Mëllerdall

- → UNESCO Global Geoparks: regions with a geological heritage of international importance
- → In geoparks, geology helps to sensitize the population to the environment and to strengthen the regional identity.
- → International network of the UNESCO Global Geoparks
- → In autumn 2020, the Natur- & Geopark Mëllerdall will submit its new candidacy for the UNESCO Global Geoparks program



Distance to Luxembourg City: +/- 20km (+/- 30 min.)

- → The Moselle river: 42 km (Schengen Wasserbillig)
- → Natural border between Luxembourg, Germany and France
- → Characteristics: only wine growing region in

 Luxembourg (about 1300ha of area under cultivation),
 river, orchards, forests
- → 9% surface area -> +/- 230 km2


_3 Dream Loops in Luxembourg

The "Saar-Hunsrück Dream Loops"

Dense network of **111 fantastic premium circular trails** in the region between Moselle, Rhine, Saar, and Nahe:

- → Hiking at highest level
- → Active and recreation-seeking hikers
- → High quality walking circuits:
 - narrow nature-oriented paths
 - impressive stone formations
 - idyllic water courses
 - breath-taking panoramic look-out points with truthful boundless views
- → Well signed in both directions

Schengen without Borders


7,7 km | 3H00 | Hm: 420 | Difficulty 2 **European Museum**

- → Winegrowing village of Schengen synonym for a borderless Europe
- → Famous because of the signing of the "Schengen Agreement" in 1985.
- → Protected nature area Strombierg
- → Winegrowing village of Contz-les-Bains (FR)
- → Magnificent views into the Moselle valley, steep vineyards, broad panoramic views in the direction of Saarland in Germany and Lorraine in France

_Wine & Nature Path Palmberg

9,0 km | 3H30 | Hm: 309 | Difficulty 2 First class quality of our Luxemburgish wines and Crémants

- → Steep shell lime cliffs of the Palmberg
- → Glorious views of Ahn & into the Moselle valley
- → Protected nature area with a population of older box trees (Palm = box tree / -berg = hill)
- → Meadows full of wild orchids
- → Valley of Donverbach with its waterfalls and canyon forest





9,6 km | 3H00 | Hm: 276 | Difficulty 2 Nature conservation centre A Wiewesch

- → Protected nature reserve Manternacher Fiels
- → Orchards & impressive canyon forest
- → Gigantic rock strata along the Michelslay
- → Passages through the narrow Kerbtal of the Schlammbach
- → Extraordinary panoramic views on the Lelliger Plateau
- → A vineyard in the middle of the forest
- → Stair steps of the old vineyard
- → Rated at 92/100 experience points by the German Hiking Institute





